EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

With the blessing of God, the purpose of this study is to provide Counsel's assessment of the feasibility of opening a Lutheran elementary school in La Crosse County, WI.

Primary Findings

- The primary support for enrolling a child in the proposed school is the desire for high-quality Lutheran, Christian, and Values-Based education and environment to counter the secular, low-performing public schools, excellent teaching, and a dynamic offering of curricular and co-curricular programs such as before and after-school programs and special education services (Consider Lutheran Special Education Ministries in Detroit, MI)
- All four congregations generally agree the best location for a school plant is in the Holmen area. Holmen appears to provide the highest current and future community / residential growth potential.
 - Faith Lutheran Church and Student Center, Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, and Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church are approaching school formation as a mission project.
 - Gift of Grace Lutheran Church Holmen is approaching the project as local evangelism outreach. A location with easy access from neighboring communities in Trempeleau and Galesville would add additional potential.
 - Shepherd's Flock Preschool Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church has operated for many years and is highly regarded. Families with children attending the Preschool continue to inquire about continuing educational opportunities.
- The La Crosse area has a culture of strong Christian (WELS and Catholic) schools. Many elementary schools are at or near capacity. All are located in the southern/central portion of La Crosse County, several miles south of the Holmen area.
- Gift of Grace Lutheran Church is in temporary space and desirous of relocation to a permanent and functional facility. They are open to considering the development of a new dual-use facility (school and church).

Primary Findings Continued

- In hiring the founding principal, attention should be paid to entrepreneurial candidates who are willing and able to engage with the community and raise money regularly and systematically.
- Concerns to be addressed:
 - A desire for excellent teaching and learning, a variety of co-curricular activities, and school safety and security are the primary enrollment concerns among parents interviewed.
 - The financial ability of parents to afford tuition and fees. A proposed tuition comparable to the \$4,380 for 2023-24 for St. Paul's Lutheran School in Onalaska, WI would need to be established at or near that figure. \$5,000 tuition was mentioned as the possible starting point by those interviewed. In any case, tuition will need to be high enough to meet the proposed financial models and adequate tuition assistance for all families. We recommend one tuition figure for all students with no automatic discounts like second-child discounts or limits on tuition based on family size.
 - It is unlikely that significant funding will be realized from the congregations. Association congregation members who attend the new school may likely receive an "Association Scholarship" to provide a tangible benefit for association families.
 - Securing a location where the school can be built or located.
 - There is a general lack of awareness that such a school is being planned (absence of a definite site).
 - Unknown school-related transportation alternatives.
 - Funding the school will include tuition/fees, association church support, and fundraising/third-source income.

School Alternatives

PRIVATE SCHOOL ALTERNATIVE SUMMARY

- Private school alternatives for the proposed elementary school include:
 - Immanuel Lutheran School (WELS) in La Crosse, WI with 80 students from pre-school through grade eight.
 - St. Paul's Lutheran School in Onalaska, WI (WELS) with 217 K 8 students
 - Coulee Christian School in West Salem, WI with 175 students in Pre-K 12 also offering K 3 located at First Free Church in Onalaska in 2023.
 - First Lutheran Evangelical School (WELS) in La Crosse, WI with 133 students in grades pre-kindergarten through eight
 - Christ-St. John's Lutheran School (WELS) in West Salem, WI with 91 students in pre-kindergarten to grade eight
 - Mt Calvary-Grace Lutheran School (WELS) in La Crosse with 88 students pre-kindergarten through grade eight.
 - Faith Baptist School La Crosse with 22 students in pre-kindergarten through grade 12
 - Luther High School Onalaska. Owned and operated by 30 WELS congregations withing a 40 mile radius of La Crosse operating 13 grade schools

PUBLIC SCHOOL ALTERNATIVE SUMMARY

- Public school alternatives for the proposed elementary school include:
 - La Crosse Public Schools are declining in enrollment. An effort to consolidate high schools was defeated by voters in 2022. Recently, plans have been announced to close at least one elementary school for the 2024-25 school year.
 - Onalaska Public Schools
 - Holmen Public Schools include three elementary schools, one middle school, and a high school. Enrollment is stable. The average K-12 class size is estimated at 275 - 300 students. These schools are attractive and seem to be popular in the community
 - Galesville–Trempleleau-Ettrick (G-E-T) Public Schools

Conclusion of Feasibility Team

It is Counsel's opinion that the information developed to date supports further study of a proposed Lutheran school in La Crosse County.

The next steps in the study process should include:

- Formalization of a Strategic Plan and timetable for school development.
- A financial feasibility analysis including projected costs and income for the first five years.
- Securing a strategically located site.
 - An ideal location would include 5+ acres, easily accessible, highly visible, and adjacent to growing residential areas.
 - Clarification of alternatives related to the development of a new dual-use facility with Gift of Grace Lutheran Church, Holmen.
- Develop a plan for long-term, sustained fundraising.





STUDY PROCESS

THE STUDY PROCESS

Documents Examined Included:

- Demographic Study provided by the South Wisconsin District, LCMS that included a 10 and 20-minute radius of a potential building site in Holmen, WI.
- The minutes of five Study Team meetings held in 2023 with the latest being October 17, 2023.
- Genesis Feasibility Study application form.
- Surveys were taken by various stakeholders including parents, students, teachers, school administrator, and the general community.
- Websites of all LCMS churches and other independent schools in La Crosse County, WI.
- A White Paper was prepared by the Steering Committee before the December 15-16 LCSC consultant's visit.

The Steering Committee provided Counsel with a tour of the community for the proposed school.


VISION STATEMENT

The following white paper was drafted by Jim Magnuson with help from the Steering Committee:

BACKGROUND

The opening page of the South Wisconsin District website contains the following banner. It provides inspiration and direction for congregations to think and act boldly to advance the Gospel message.

"This is our time to be distinctly Lutheran, to plant new congregations and new schools, to honor Christ-centered vocations, to embrace our communities."



The history and heritage of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod placed a strong emphasis on the establishment of Christian Schools. In Gospel DNA - Five Markers of a Flourishing Church, Michael Newman - President of the Texas District of LCMS writes:

"(LCMS) established a network of schools – elementary, high schools, colleges and seminaries – for the purpose of discipleship. These Lutheran Schools were not merely places for indoctrination of the preservation of the culture. They became centers of missionary training and sending....to this day, Lutheran schools are a treasure of discipleship – of promoting the truth. God has brought the world to LCMS classrooms – including many unchurched children, young people and adults. School classrooms are places where the love of Christ can be seen for the very first time, where the truth of the Gospel can embrace hearts that need hope, and where that calling to make Christ's difference in a broken world and be heard and followed."

In this spirit, Jim and Marilyn Magnuson, Carrie Cunningham and Pastor David Baumgarn met with South Wisconsin District LCMS executives Rev. Dr. Nathan Meador (Mission Executive) and Dr. Chris Cody (Education Executive) on June 28, 2022. The meeting was called at our request. Its purpose was to open a dialogue with SWD regarding:

THE VISION

- A Christian School is consistent with our Lord's command to us in Matthew 28. "Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."
- A Christian school provides natural and ongoing outreach opportunities to meet and develop relationships with young families. These relationships will lead to opportunities introduce them to the Gospel message.
- This initiative would provide a positive and exciting point for members of all area congregations to rally around. What better way to leave a legacy than to positively affect the lives of area young people and to introduce and strengthen them with Christian faith and values?

THE K-12 EDUCATIONAL ENVIRONMENT

- Parents are concerned about the erosion of traditional values in K-12 education including the infiltration of "woke" culture, politics in the classroom, sexual / gender issues, lack of respect for teachers and other students, and declining student mastery of basic reading, writing, language, math and science skills. These trends accelerated during the pandemic leaving many students behind grade level.
- Reports show over 1.2 million K-12 students left public education for private, and home school in the US last year.
- The 2022 National Assessment of Educational Progress released in October 2022 shows that Catholic Schools (and we would expect Lutheran schools as well) were a bright spot in an otherwise dismal report on student progress. "From the beginning of the pandemic, American Catholic schools have shown how community-focused, mission-driven leadership can benefit children. Today, if U.S Catholic schools were a state, their 1.6 million students would rank first in the nation across the NAEP reading and math tests for fourth and eighth graders." WSJ October 27, 2022
- National trends increasing school choice alternatives including private and religious schools are growing. Initiatives to expand school choice in Arizona, Arkansas, and Iowa are of particular note. The timely start of a local Christian school initiative would help us be fully prepared to take advantage of such a change should it occur in Wisconsin.

THE K-12 EDUCATIONAL ENVIRONMENT (CONT)

- St. Paul Lutheran, Onalaska (WELS) K-8 school enrollment is reported to be full for the coming year. St. Paul has announced a school expansion project however we understand they have been challenged by high construction costs.
- Dr. Chris Cody confirmed that parochial school enrollment is "through the roof" nationwide.
- New and innovative educational and classroom models (ex. Micro School), including utilization of technology, allow for expanding the curriculum and reducing costs.

WHY HOLMEN:

- A study used by the Holmen Area Fire Department shows the total population of Holmen and Town of Holland will be 16,163 in 2022. This is up from 12,852 in 2011 or a 10-year increase of 25.7%. The Holmen / Holland population is expected to continue to grow reaching 17,105 by 2030.
- The La Crosse Area Family YMCA recently announced the receipt of a gift of six acres of land on the north edge of Holmen. When developed, the new YMCA would serve not only the Holmen Community but also Trempealeau and Galesville.
- The growth of the Holmen community has been on the radar of the South Wisconsin District of LCMS for some time. District executives have indicated in discussions over the past two years and re-confirmed at our most recent meeting, that SWD is interested in working with area LCMS churches in supporting both Ministry and Educational initiatives in this growing area.
- There are no other Christian school alternatives in the immediate Holmen / Holland area. In addition, Holmen improves opportunities to attract students from the Galesville and Trempealeau areas.
- Gift of Grace congregation in Holmen has recently affiliated with LCMS and provides a local connection to the community.
- Gift of Grace is currently in a leased facility and is looking for a more permanent solution to their space needs. This opens the potential for a shared church/school concept.

SHEPHERD OF THE HILLS ROLE AND IMPACT:

- The original founding documents of Shepherd of the Hills included the stated intention to open a K-8 school.
- Shepherd of the Hills has joined an association of LCMS congregations in Minnesota to support Hope High School-Winona. Several Shepherd of the Hills children are now attending Hope High School.
- Shepherd of the Hills offers scholarships to member families who attend a K-12 Christian school.
- Shepherd's Flock Pre-school has grown to 19 morning students. The preschool director has received several inquiries bout continued Christian educational opportunities. A successful preschool has strong potential to be a feeder for a Christian school.
- Dr. Chris Cody toured the Shepherd of the Hills Campus and indicated the SOTH facility could accommodate a Christian elementary school function with minimal modifications.
- A project of this magnitude should ideally be a regional effort including the involvement of area LCMS congregations including Shepherd of the Hills - Onalaska, Prince of Peace - West Salem, Faith - La Crosse, and Gift of Grace - Holmen would be logical partners.
- Addressing Concerns: An understandable concern is the potential impact of this initiative on each of the four individual congregation partners. "If you think that sending leaders, starting new ministries, and planting multiplying churches depletes a local ministry, think again. New churches that multiplied and supported multiplication exhibited stronger growth than churches that did not focus on intentional multiplication. Intentional multiplication is good for the church. Church planting congregations know that planting leads to growth and vibrancy." Newman

When schools flourish, matters stand well, and the church is saved. Let them call us doctors and masters if they please, but youth is the seed and the fount of the church. Where would other doctors and masters come from after we are dead if there were no schools. We are compelled to have schools in the church. God preserves the church through schools."






FOCUS GROUP AND SURVEYS

FOCUS GROUP INPUT

- The school will be uniquely Lutheran in the LCMS tradition.
- The school will attract and welcome non-Lutheran students from families who want their children in a school that upholds traditional values and provides an excellent academic education.
- The school should grow in stages, starting with a preschool or Kindergarten and then adding other grades. A dual-grade system K-1, 2-3, or similar would be appropriate.
- A location in Holmen is desirable as the northern part of the county is experiencing the greatest population growth compared to the City of La Crosse or Onalaska.
- Extra-curricular opportunities such as music, art and experiential learning could be important elements as the school grows.
- The new school's focus will be on training children and serving families with various programs designed to strengthen families.
- The school will be a principal mission of the member congregations.
- Locating a site and funding are recognized as the two biggest challenges in starting a school.
- Providing LCMS-trained faculty is a priority for hiring.
- Establishing a formal Association model that includes the four churches interviewed in this study as both a source of funding and a source for prayerful encouragement and strategic support is desired. Congregational funding would come from new commitments that are over and above normal stewardship giving.
- A desired purpose for the school is to be a mission to the unchurched families in La Crosse County with the hope of the congregations reaching out to them to invite them to minister to them as they are able.

DO YOU FEEL THERE IS A NEED FOR A LUTHERAN SCHOOL?




Notable Comments

- While there are a number of Christian schools in the La Crosse area, the Holmen area does not offer a non-public alternative. Holmen is a growing community with many young families.




Notable Comments

The above graph shows a net promoter score of 3. It is important to note that the net promoter score ranges between -100 to 100. A net promoter score above 0 is considered good.

Commentary on Community Survey

The results from the community survey show promising support and interest from the community. A majority of the 84 survey participants indicated a need, interest, and value of an LCMS Lutheran school.

An LCMS elementary school presence would be a welcome addition to those and would support a group of families. As noted Holmen appears to be a valuable site with current demographic growth and movement from the southern area of La Crosse. A tuition range between 4500 and 5500 should be considered, although the number may be lowered through the Wisconsin Choice program.

The association must consider scholarshiping large families to encourage growth and support of the school. As a notable comment suggested \$8000 max for a family of 3. Pulling from home school families or offering services will also offer a source of viability.


The net promoter score falls in the "Good" results at 3. Ideally for immediate success, we would like to see this number for 10 although competition with WELS and Catholic families may keep this number lower.

There were no concerns raised or noted in the responses to this survey.


CONGREGATION SURVEY DATA: NOTABLE RESULTS


Commitment of Pastor to Lutheran Schools




Congregation's vision for outreach through a new school ministry



Availability of children in the Congregation








Notable Comments

- If we are TRUELY committed we can make this happen. This is a muchneeded way to serve our community & and spread God's LOVE.
- Not enough kids in the congregations. Not enough giving to support it. Plenty of other Lutheran School options in the area already.
- Holmen is a growing community of young families looking for an alternative to public schools. Holmen is also near 2 other communities just north of LaCrosse County. Gift of Grace sees this as a wonderful mission opportunity for their congregation.
- Gift of Grace serves the Holmen community. The community demographic is primarily young families. We believe many of these families are open to alternatives to public school.
- Establishing a school is very expensive and maintaining it is very labor intensive. Not sure the 4 congregations can handle it on an ongoing basis.
- It would be tough to compete with strong wels schools already in place
- Start-up is easier than maintaining and committing to pay long-term salaries and benefits.
- I am at the end of life so it is up to younger people to carry this through.
- We are a small congregation with faithful givers. We haven't grown much over the years so all of our "doers" are close to being burnt out. Need the Spirit to light a fire in our hearts...

Commentary on Congregation Survey

The congregation survey shows a mix of support. Members see a need in the community, a potential value add to the community, and that children (in the Holmen area) are available. That said the congregations as a whole have mixed views of a Lutheran school as an outreach.

Understanding that the congregations have few children, this ministry can be seen as a community outreach to help strengthen the congregation and bring new families to Christ.


Financial viability from the congregation only does not appear to be there. Comments indicate that a of "doers" are beginning to feel burned out. As noted a school is a tough process to start and maintain, congregation support and view as a ministry is highly necessary.

Although those items are a cause for concern, the overall understanding that pastors are committed to Lutheran schools is a critical point for potential sustainability. A congregation that sees the pastor leading the charge as a ministry outreach will have far greater influence internally than any other initiative.


SCHOOL PARENT SURVEY DATA

Note that only 8 parents responded tot he PArent Climate Survey


Do you feel your initial expectations have been met?

Commentary on Congregation Survey

As noted only 8 responses were received for this survey. Parents believe the school is meeting expectations and would encourage others to send their children. This group is a good starting point for any potential school start. They appear to be a hardy core of potential parents.

Any potential school will be seen as a mission outreach to the non-Lutheran community. Connecting those unchurched parents to make them feel accepted and welcomed to the church will be critical to church and school growth.

SCHOOL STAFF SURVEY DATA

Only 3 responses were submitted to the teacher survey.

Nothing of concern was noted in the survey and teachers have a strong appreciation for their Director and Board. They care about the school and believe facilities are adequate.

The only real comment of note was that the church is open to the public which causes a slight security concern while students utilize some of the public space in the church.

PRIMARY FINDINGS

PRIMARY FINDINGS REGARDING THE DEVELOPMENT OF A NEW LUTHERAN SCHOOL IN LA CROSSE COUNTY INCLUDE:

- The desire is clear for an intentionally Christ-centered, academically rich, elementary school with traditional values.
- Funding for the Lutheran school will be a significant need.
 - Tuition, even at \$5,000, will be a challenge for families of school students as they are not used to paying tuition.
 - Provisions of the Wisconsin School voucher program are unknown. It is unlikely that any near-term aggressive changes favoring expanded school choice will be approved in Wisconsin.
 - Gathering third-source funding through fundraising will be a challenge without trained staff, especially since many of those who are likely to fund the new school currently financially support their home congregation.
 - School leadership will need to possess an entrepreneurial spirit in addition to traditional school leadership skills dealing with management, curriculum, and programming.
- A known location for the schools will help in growing community support and funding opportunities.
- The steering committee should investigate other school models including the micro-school concept, South Wisconsin District's Neighborhood Schools project, and the use of online resources available from various LCMS-affiliated providers.

ADVANTAGES TO STARTING A LUTHERAN SCHOOL:

- A motivated and highly skilled Steering Committee is in place. Many members have teaching and/or administrative experience in public and parochial schools
- There appears to be available land for a campus.
- Private school competition is concentrated in the southern part of La Crosse County with no Lutheran/Christian elementary schools available in the northern part of the county.
- A population large enough to ensure sustainability for another independent school.
- A steadily growing population supported by a somewhat diverse economy.

DISADVANTAGES TO STARTING A LUTHERAN SCHOOL:

- Robust independent, Christian schools already exist, and differentiating the new school from them will be a challenge.
- The founding congregations do not have a large number of young families with early elementary-age children.
- The population of elementary school-age students is proposed to slightly decline in the next five years to less than 1%.
- A dearth of trained professional Lutheran school leaders to lead the initiative.





CONCLUSION OF FEASIBILITY

CONCLUSION OF FEASIBILITY

The desire, logic, and energy to found and operate a Lutheran school in La Crosse County is clear and needs to be prayerfully pursued. The Steering Committee is composed of diverse, talented, and faithful individuals and should continue to meet and plan for the future founding of a school. The biggest challenge, and opportunity, will be to find a suitable, attractive, and affordable location for the school and establish a funding model that is both realistic and sustainable for the school's immediate and future needs.

As you consider the model for establishing a Lutheran school in La Crosse County, it is prudent to enlist the talents, experience, and resources of the Wisconsin South District of the LCMS, LCMS Schools, and the Lutheran Church Extension Fund. These organizations provide excellent resources in establishing schools, building and funding campuses, developing curriculum, creating sustainable funding solutions, and maintaining our unique Lutheran approach to ministry and schools.

A start-up Lutheran elementary school with grades pre-K-8 should be able to maintain an enrollment of around eighty students in La Crosse County. Double-graded classrooms in grades 1-8 will be prudent in the early years. The positive effect of multiple-grade classroom learning is well documented. This number, though, will take several years to obtain. Until that time, wise financial, educational, and spiritual guidance is essential. We encourage you to continue the process of moving forward to establish, staff, and open your Lutheran school.

Leadership is Key

The "right" leader is needed. Providing the right leader (founding Principal) for the school is the most important decision to be made. Initial needs are for the leader to develop relationships with school, church, and community leaders.

Plan for Success

Place an emphasis on proper planning. Develop a strategic plan of action that focuses all effort on the vision. Provide a business plan that fully supports the strategic plan with realistic cost projections and realistic revenue projections. Fundamentally the business plan must demonstrate that the proposed school can open and be sustained based on realistic estimates of enrollment, tuition revenue with discounts considered, congregational support, and donor support. Without significant funding in addition to tuition and fees, whether from congregations or from long-term donors of major gifts, a tuition of around \$5,000 should be considered. Use findings of this study to improve vision statements and to support strategic and business planning. Consider consultation services for these essential aspects of school planning.

Get the Word Out

Prepare an aggressive marketing plan for the proposed program. Include an emphasis on public relations in addition to paid promotion. Fully develop a school website, events, and print materials to reflect the vision. Begin by sharing the results of this study with key constituencies such as members of Faith, Prince of Peace, Shepherd of the Hills, and Gift of Grace Lutheran Churches, area pastors of all denominations, community leaders especially those who have shown interest in this project, and parents with children attending Lutheran pre-schools at local Lutheran congregations. Consider consultation services for this essential aspect of school planning.

Learn From Others

Visit and examine recent Lutheran school starts to learn and more, remembering that all education is local and what may work in one location may not be appropriate at yours. Identify what should be emulated and what should be avoided.

Select the Governance Model

Provide congregations the opportunity to become founders of a new Lutheran school by forming an association of congregations to support the school. Be prepared to form an "autonomous" Lutheran school if there is insufficient interest in the formation of that association.

Next Steps

- Share the results of this study with key constituencies. Be sure to ask them, "What do you think?"
- Decide whether to proceed with detailed planning.
- Prepare a detailed Strategic Plan, Business Plan, and Marketing Plan.
- Decided whether to implement the plans and open the school.

IMPLEMENTING THE RECOMMENDATIONS

School planting is an ongoing process, and a school must maintain a quality Christian education program. The LSCS recommendations are intended to provide action plans that will direct the school to develop improvement. The LSCS consultant encourages the school to develop and implement action plans to address the issues highlighted in the assessment report.

We recommend that you:

- Pray for God's guidance and direction as you seek to develop and implement the school planting recommendations.
- Distribute the report to all constituents (pastors, other congregation leaders, and community leaders). While the entire report need not be duplicated in its entirety, sections of the report may be communicated to the respective groups.
- Read and become familiar with the assessment report.
- Commit to assisting in implementing the recommendations of the assessment report.

FINAL THOUGHTS

I was thoroughly impressed with the love that the school supporters have for the possibility of a new LCMS elementary school in La Crosse County. You are blessed with outstanding leadership, a strong interest from the supporting congregations, and an intentional dedication to Lutheran identity. The Steering Committee, Pastors, and Congregational Members were generous in their time, and it was a joy to speak with each group.

The Lutheran school and churches in La Crosse County have a tremendous opportunity to share Jesus with young people in creative and intentional ways. You have been blessed with wise and resolute leaders who will enable you to pursue your goals in a way that honors the Lord and achieves the desire to offer Lutheran education opportunities in your community.














